## **Call Time On Cruelty**

With you by our side, we can step in and change the fate of vulnerable animals



It feels like just yesterday that I was writing to you as the warm weather had started to arrive, and we were looking ahead to all our summer plans. Wonderful supporters, like you, came along in your thousands to our events, and helped us to raise funds for our favourite breed... 'Rescue.'



It's been an incredibly busy time, and we have taken in so many animals who've needed us. In just one

day, we welcomed 17 vulnerable dogs and 15 homeless kittens, which is truly unprecedented. Taking in so many animals in one go really hits our resources hard, and we are sincerely grateful to you for keeping us going during these tough times.

Not only has there been a hugely increased demand for spaces in our rescue centres, but the kind of cases we are seeing are, very sadly, involving more neglect and cruelty. You can read more about the plight of these brave animals and how you can support us to Call Time On Cruelty.

With all hands on deck to drop everything and provide the urgent care so many of our new residents need, it's been hard to get regular maintenance done at our rescue centres. Thankfully, not only have we been taking animals in, but we've also met the most incredible rehomers, who we've been privileged to have matched with new family members. ## Dedication

### Matt & Gill Devereux

One Sunday, back in 1991, a kind couple visited us to drop off some donations... Over three decades later, the same couple have just retired from their integral roles within our charity.

Here is their story: "We'd heard about Margaret Green Animal Rescue from the dog training club we joined when we moved to Dorset. Along with some other club members, we decided to visit the Lincoln Farm centre to deliver some donations.

Margaret Green, herself, was there that day, and we got chatting to her about the history of the charity and the improvements that were desperately needed in order to benefit all the rescue dogs.

We were so moved by what we heard, that we immediately talked to our club members, who set about raising funds for the materials required. That just left the need for people to carry out the work. Luckily, we were able to persuade 40 willing club members to give up several weekends, get busy laying concrete paths, constructing exercise enclosures and painting walls. We even managed to pick up and rotate a large timber building, that housed four kennels, so that the deserving dogs had a better view! Over the next few years, our group transported dogs from Dorset to the newly-established Devon centre. Gill and I also fostered Amy, a small Poodle, who was in need of lots of special care in order to prepare her for rehoming.

We are incredibly grateful for the dedication and commitment that Matt & Gill have made towards our charity, and we wish them a long and happy retirement.

we got to know Margaret and the team better. In 2001, I was invited to become a Trustee and Gill was asked to become Dog Behaviourist & Trainer. Over the next 5 years, we worked

> with the other trustees and the management team to improve the animal facilities across all three centres, and to implement new procedures and IT systems. At the same time, Gill trained the staff in dog behaviour, and introduced assessment & rehabilitation processes to enable dogs with behavioural issues to be successfully rehomed.

During this period, the charity also developed new Marketing and Fundraising plans, and our supporter numbers grew from 1,000 to more than 8,000.

It hasn't all been smooth sailing. We have suffered from major floods and lightning strikes, one of which destroyed all the electrical equipment at Lincoln Farm. We have had seriously injured dogs thrown over fences and animals dumped outside our gates. We can't praise the staff enough for the way they responded to such incidents.

Upon our retirement this year, we were asked to highlight our greatest pride which, for us, is simple to state - The charity today delivers the highest standards of animal welfare to all those in need.

Finally, we have left an amazing team of staff and volunteers. Margaret Green would have been delighted by what has been achieved."





## The rescue of vulnerable mums and their babies

After receiving a call in March, when the freezing temperatures had been consistently challenging for us all, we attended a shocking scene where many dogs were existing in conditions that were simply unthinkable.

Along with multiple organisations, we came to the dogs' aid and our team took as many as we could house safely in our facilities. We knew we had reached these sweet souls at a critical time, as they had been living with scarce water and food, and no shelter from the harsh elements.

Once we transported the 25 dogs back to our facilities, we were able to start assessing the needs of the 7 adult females and 18 puppies. We quickly set to work on ensuring they received the medical attention they needed and removing the urine and faeces that were stained and caked on to their delicate fur. During the vet consultations, we also learnt that one of the adult females – who we had named Cassie - was likely to be pregnant.

Over time, we got to know these precious poppets, and their beautiful personalities began to shine through. A few weeks passed and then, late one night, Cassie went into labour. Our dedicated team stayed with her through the night to ensure she could bring her 7 sweet babies safely into the world.

Cassie was a wonderful mum to her little pups and, once they were ready, we were delighted to find all the beautiful dogs their loving new homes, where they could continue to thrive and enjoy the happy lives they deserve. Your support enables us to react urgently to the next situation that heads our way, and be there for the many rescue animals that need us.

Responding to urgent welfare cases and providing veterinary treatment and around the clock care for 32 vulnerable dogs, with no notice, rapidly uses up our resources and reserves. The veterinary costs, alone, for these dogs was in excess of £6,000.

Throughout the year, we have been taking in more litters of kittens than we have seen for a very long time. Sadly, the little ones have sometimes entered our care without their mums, which has resulted in us having to hand rear the kittens to ensure they have the care and attention they need.

One litter of kittens that we looked after this year, who we playfully named Brad Kitt, Cat Damon, Meowly Cyrus & Cindy Clawford, arrived at just 7 days old, and our team worked all day and night to feed them and make sure they felt safe and loved.

Sadly, on arrival, we noticed that Mary had an extremely swollen and painful right hind leg due to an injury, which was believed to have happened during her time as a racing Greyhound.

Having previously undergone surgery, before coming to the centre, to try and fuse the joint, it was clear that the fusion had not been sufficient and was not healing as we hoped. As a result, we took



the vet's advice and decided to amputate Mary's leg, to give her the best quality of life possible. Mary was such a brave girl during her recovery and is now a totally different dog! She is full of life and absolutely thriving, having adapted to having three legs remarkably well. We are so pleased that Mary has now gone to her loving new home, where she will be able to live a happy and pain-free life. We can't wait to see her continue to blossom with her forever family.





We regularly receive enquiries and take in kittens in need of help, some of whom have been found abandoned.

It is heartbreaking to see these helpless souls lost and in need of TLC, but we are committed to making sure they receive the help they need, and go on to find their forever homes. Heavily pregnant and wandering alone, this sweet Cocker Spaniel must have been so desperate for a friendly face to come along and scoop her up into safety.

On arrival, it was obvious that Tonks had a swollen belly, and it was likely she was in pup. We took her to the vet, who carried out a scan, which confirmed our assumption – there were around 7 puppies, and their arrival was imminent.

We made Tonks' kennel warm and cosy, and tried to keep her as calm and relaxed as possible - we knew life was about to get very busy for this mum-to-be. After two weeks in our care, the signs had started - Tonks was in labour.

Our team made sure everything was progressing well, and Tonks was a brave superstar who made sure she delivered her 7 babies safely.

Having immediately settled into her new role as a mum, we were able to give her the support and love she needed to ensure her puppies were healthy and happy, and growing well.

Her puppies are absolutely adorable, chunky little poppets. They're incredibly cheeky and playful, and we're relieved they will never know anything about the uncertain futures they could have faced.

Tonks and her 7 sweeties will soon be going to their new homes, and this little rescue chapter will be a distant memory in their long and happy lives.

## **Purrr-fect kitten cuties**

We can't always anticipate an influx of a certain species, and this year has been no exception. Having received a steady intake of unwanted kittens throughout the year, we reached September and early October and there was a massive surge in enquiries from people needing to hand over multiple litters of kittens. In just one month, we took in over 30 kittens across our centres, which puts a huge strain on our resources.

Knowing how important it is to ensure kittens receive the right care and socialisation to help them become happy adult cats, we have been making space wherever we can, so that these deserving darlings get the best start possible. Luckily, many of these litters have arrived at the centre with their mums, which means they will be able to have as normal a start as possible and, once weaned, we can begin searching for forever homes for our hardworking mums. As cats tend to enjoy being out and about, it's really important to prevent any surprises by making sure your cats are given all the preventative care they need. We all want the best for our beloved pets, and we truly believe it's nicer to neuter.



## Cock-a-doodle don't...

We have had the absolute pleasure of caring for a fabulous foursome of feathered friends for the last few months, and they've certainly kept us entertained with their daily antics!

Unusually, we haven't taken in many chickens this year certainly not as many as we had anticipated following the surge in backyard chicken-keeping during Lock



Down. We believe this is likely to be as a result of the increased cost and lack of availability of eggs in the supermarkets, which is encouraging many people to keep their chickens.

Rocky, Bingo, Belinda & Rita, however, were brought to us when their owner was finding them difficult to manage. These cluckin' cute chickens were hatched by their owner, in the hope that mainly hens would emerge from their eggs. This is an issue that we hear about each year from chicken keepers. Even with the best of intentions, only hoping to hatch hens is unrealistic, and once you find yourself with cockerels it can be extremely challenging to rehome these handsome, confident (but extremely noisy) boys. We are appealing to chicken keepers and schools to strongly consider the welfare of any chickens that are produced during a hatching project. If you cannot offer a forever home to one or more cockerels, please do the right thing and look into taking on rescue animals instead.


We love animals in all shapes and sizes, and we believe every single one deserves to feel loved and wanted.





## A 'hoppy' update from our rescue rabbits

Over the last few years, we have been desperate to improve our rabbit area at Church Knowle, to ensure our rescue bunnies have the best possible experience during their time in our care.

We frequently have a long waiting list of rabbits who need to come into rescue, but sadly it often takes time for our rabbit residents to find their forever families. Because of this, we like to ensure our rabbits have plenty of space and enrichment to keep them entertained, whilst they wait for their special someone to come and sweep them off their paws.

After 4 years in development, we are delighted to have opened our brandnew rabbitry, which features inside and outside areas in every enclosure, and gives our bunnies 24-hour access to the outdoors.

This is something we are passionate about, as it means our rabbits can choose where they spend their time.

We were very grateful to receive a fantastic £6,300 donation from Co-op in Wareham & Sandford towards the work. We can't thank the teams at Co-op enough for supporting us in this way and for helping us to make our vision become a reality. There is still a long way to go with education regarding rabbit welfare and ensuring they have enough space to live happily. We hope this new area will show what a difference it makes when rabbits can roam without being restricted to a hutch.

If you are visiting our Church Knowle centre, do check out these facilities and discover the amazing benefits they're bringing to our little friends.

- **(1)** Constant access to the outdoor areas enables our bunnies to display natural behaviours, and has also limited the amount of handling we have to do, as we no longer need to pick them up and place them into their outdoor runs. Even though some of our furry friends are happy with this interaction, not all rabbits like to be handled and it has helped to reduce the need for us to do this.
- In addition, we can help our bunnies with their carrier training whilst in our care, to get them used to hopping into a carrier for when they need to go to their all-important vet visits or, better still, when the time comes for them to go to their new homes.
- 3 Not only has the new rabbitry created much more outdoor space and increased our rabbits' freedom, but it has also provided them with greater opportunities to hide and enjoy their enrichment activities, which is such a joy for us to see.
