I would like to start by saying thank you to everybody who has supported us through the winter and I am sure you share my delight that warmer days are approaching.

It has been a difficult year, however all of us at the centres and shops are excited to begin to return to a more normal life. The charity shops have reopened and it has been so encouraging to welcome customers and volunteers back. We are also beginning to open our rescue centres, including the visitor element at Church Knowle opening on the 22nd June, which we know will put a smile on many faces! The boarding facilities are also open at our centres which will really help towards the costs of running the charity.

During the past few months we have seen, particularly with dogs, an increase in issues with socialisation and thefts. We are committed to educating our community to help reduce the need for animals to come to us with socialisation concerns because the majority of the time this can be avoided initially in the home. Our hearts went out to those who have experienced thefts of their pets. As breeding demand increases, sadly so does the price of puppies, which has resulted in higher reports of dogs being stolen.

After the delays in 2020 the majority of the work started this year was spent completing two of our major projects which you can read all about on page 14. We really are thrilled with the results.

Thank you to everyone who did a Sponsored Walk from home, we had to change the event slightly but this didn't stop you from wanting to raise money for our rescue animals. We are all prepping for the up and coming events, see updates on the back page, which we will hopefully see you at - it'll make a nice change to a computer screen!



Although they were in good condition they all needed extensive dental treatment. As we reported in our last summer newsletter, it is extremely important to take the care of your dog's teeth seriously, otherwise it can result in expensive vet bills. We often hear how shocked people are by the cost of having teeth removed.

The good thing is, there are steps you can take to help improve your dog's dental hygiene. The most effective way is to brush them every day with a dog-specific toothbrush

and vet recommended Enzyme toothpaste for dogs. If this is something new to you or you would like any advice please do get in touch with us. Our contact details are on page 2.

These four gorgeous dogs have found their forever homes, unsurprisingly they had lots of interest! This was fantastic as it meant we could find them their perfect home with their new families.


The four dogs had a combined total of 43 teeth extracted, costing over £1,000.

Aurora is a two year old Saluki that came into our care as a stray and was emaciated and terrified. Whenever anyone visited her kennel, she would push herself into the back of her bed, hide her head and shake uncontrollably in fear, it really was heart-breaking to see.

Although she would initially still try to hide, she would accept gentle affection and slowly started to reciprocate. We knew we had to find a special home for Aurora and one which already had another sighthound to help give her confidence.

We found her a home with a family who already had another lovely Lurcher called Max. After a couple of meetings, Aurora

had already become attached to Max. However, it wasn't plain sailing for her or the family. When arriving home, Aurora managed to escape from the car and finding herself loose, was scared and ran off.

Although there were sightings of her that day, no one was able to find her and it wasn't until the following day, after much searching by the family, that the team from our centre and volunteers spotted her hiding by a fence.

Although scared, she seemed thankful to see familiar faces and was returned to her very emotional and very relieved owners. We're pleased to report that Aurora has

recovered from her adventure and has now settled nicely into her new home. Thank you to everyone who gave up their time to help search for Aurora, she can now sleep peacefully as she lives up to her Disney princess name!



Lockdown dogs

We took in young dogs ranging from twelve weeks to eight months that were all bought during lockdown. It didn't stop there, each time we came out of a lockdown, we started to receive similar calls again.

The dogs which had been purchased in many cases by inexperienced owners, were high energy breeds and all were brought in for the same reason. They were becoming unmanageable due to lack of exercise and training. They were very under socialised too, as it appeared that their previous owners were unsure as to how much interaction these dogs need in their young lives.

The animal welfare team had to work extensively with them, introducing them to the outside world around the centre, easing them into training and preparing them for their new homes.

We are so happy to say that they have now all found their forever homes! We wouldn't be able to help these dogs without help from you.



Frontline Support

We launched our boarding initiative in 2020 because we saw the great efforts everyone on the frontline was providing and we believed there was a way we could give back. With many empty boarding units due to lockdown, we offered to care for NHS, police and emergency service workers' pets for free during the pandemic. We were so pleased that we could support in a small way and to give back to the communities who have so kindly helped us.

"It was a fantastic help knowing that we were able to drop our dogs off at a moment's notice when required to change shifts. As the staff are fantastic, it has taken the worry out of leaving our dogs with the staff at Margaret Green Animal Rescue. We know they are safe and well looked after, they are exercised regularly, and one of them has even been taught a bit of agility. Pygmy Pals

We had two new arrivals at the centre, Timmy and Charlie, four year old Pygmy Goats. They came to us after their owner had back surgery and could no longer care for them. They were both isolated on arrival as they had a contagious skin issue. Shortly after they settled in, the team started treating their skin and they have both responded really well.

Once fully treated they will be moved from isolation into a paddock where they can take in the glorious sights of the centre! We have also had some goat bonding happening here. Max and Caesar have been introduced to Milly, they came from the same home but hadn't lived together before. We slowly introduced the pair and now they are all a very happy little group!



Three Ponies and their Recovery

Elsa and Tiggy came into our care earlier this year as their owner was unable to cope with them. Both ponies were underweight and lame. After a few days settling in, it was amazing to see how quickly they responded to some TLC. They both had dental checks, the farrier visited them and routine tests were carried out. A few more days went by and we really started to see their personalities shine through, both of them giving us a whinny when we approached.

Shortly after, we also rescued a sweet Shetland Pony called Jess who arrived very lame with overgrown feet. We X-rayed her feet then arranged for the farrier to trim them so that she would be more comfortable and be able to walk better.

We are pleased to say that all three ponies are doing much better, they are looking fantastic with shiny coats and are much brighter in themselves. Thank you to everyone who donated towards their care, you really have made a huge difference.

Projects

Previously, we updated you on the amazing funding we received for three projects at our Church Knowle Centre in Dorset. We are delighted to share their progress with you

Sand School Success

Early this year we were able to officially use the Sand School. We received a grant from Petplan and further funding from Animal Friends Pet Insurance to remove the surface, update the drainage and add new fencing.

The soft surface allows horses recovering from injury to start to exercise without concussive pressure on their feet and legs. It also allows restrictive grazing and helps manage horses' weight while allowing them to exercise freely. This is vital in managing common conditions such as laminitis.

We are so thankful to receive this funding and it will help rescue horses like Chelsea who has been enjoying the new sand school after a new case of Mud Fever.

It isn't just horses that have been loving the new area, three cheeky goats called Pepper, Splash and Squeak had lots of fun during their enrichment exercise recently.

Community Cabin

We were awarded funding from The Lottery Community Fund and Animal Friends Pet Insurance to be able to demolish and reconstruct our Community Cabin! This space will be instrumental in continuing our educational work with SEN groups and the local community. As all our projects were, the construction of the building was delayed due to COVID so after a long wait, we are absolutely thrilled to be able to open the doors and welcome groups in.



Rabbit Warren

We received funding from the local community through the Co Operative stores in Wareham and Sandford to create a whole new area for the rescue rabbits. As soon as we had the all clear to start building after lockdown eased, we were then hit with a long run of wet weather and so sadly our rabbit area has been delayed. We are due to start work any day now and we cannot wait to share the final result with you. It will benefit from a rabbit bonding pen and different examples of how you can create the right space for your rabbit accommodation. For now, we can share a design of the area which we hope to bring to life by the summer.

Fundraising

£6,000 donation from ShareGift

We were contacted by ShareGift with some delightful news. They had a £1,000 donation for the charity as part of their shareholding scheme, then a week later they contacted us again to say that they had a further £5,000 to donate!

Needless to say these donations will make a huge difference to the lives of animals in our care, much like the ones you have read about in this newsletter.

ShareGift is an independent UK registered charity (No. 1052686) that specialises in releasing the money locked up in small shareholdings but which can accept donations of any size. ShareGift works by collecting together small lots of shares until there are enough to sell, and then donating the proceeds.

ShareGift make their grants based upon suggestions from donors. You can help support Margaret Green Animal Rescue by donating any small shareholdings you may have to ShareGift, and mentioning that you support us.

If you are a UK taxpayer, you can claim income tax relief on the value of most stocks and securities when you donate them to a charity.
