Fit for Paws

Due to Buddy's larger than life personality, it took him no time at all to capture the attention of his new owner and he is now settled in his new home. enjoying all the luxuries life has to offer. Buddy took everything in his little stride. He really is a true brave 'heart'.

Buddy the Brave 'Heart'

He may weigh just 2.6kg but 13-year-old Buddy is one tough little lad.

When he arrived at the centre, he had been through the wars and needed lots of TLC, after sadly being attacked by another dog. On top of that, he also desperately needed a dental procedure, however, the vets were concerned about putting more strain on his heart. To be able to provide this procedure, the vets would need to give Buddy a general anaesthetic but this would have been too much for dear Buddy, who already suffered from a heart murmur.



We swiftly booked him in for a heart scan, so that we could establish what was going on with his ticker. The scan showed a significant mitral valve deformity alongside a septal prolapse (his septum was pushing into his left atrium when contracting) and considerable mitral valve regurgitation. As a result, both his left ventricle and atrium were enlarged - all of this put together meant that little Buddy was in the early stages of heart failure and needed some intervention to keep him healthy for as long as possible. We were all relieved to know that Buddy could take life-long medication to help support his heart.

After a few weeks on this medication, the vets were happy that his condition was stable and he would be in a much better position to cope with an anaesthetic, so his dental was booked in. He ended up having a whopping 14 teeth removed, and boy did he feel better for it once he was all healed up!

Dear Daphne

When Daphne came into our care, it was very noticeable that she was struggling to breathe. This sadly isn't an uncommon issue with French Bulldogs and often is misconstrued for being a 'cute' feature of the breed.

Daphne would have fainting episodes and wasn't able to play like her friends at the centre, but not through lack of trying! It was heart-breaking to see such a young dog (just 2 years old) with her whole life ahead of her, not being able to play with her toys. On top of that, she wasn't able to eat and was regurgitating her food due to constantly gasping for air. Because of this, she was very underweight and it was clear she needed our help straightaway.

Westmoor Veterinary Hospital performed the costly BOAS and Nares surgery, which means shortening the soft palate and widening her nostrils. After the surgery, Westmoor reported that it was the worst soft palate they have ever seen, so they had to be conservative with how much they removed due to the lack of space in this surgical area.

Daphne recovered extremely quickly and is now a totally different dog. We cannot express how amazing it was to see her doing 'zoomies' in the field and boy did she have a lot of energy to unleash! Daphne (renamed Toffee) is now happily in her new home and enjoying life and breathing easily.

Help now & beyond

We are delighted to showcase our new cattery!

This features 21 rooms so that each cat can enjoy a quiet space to rehabilitate, including a large inside and outside area so that they can display natural behaviours. Furthermore it allows the cats more room to play, jump and roam around which will help reduce stress.

With this new facility we will be far better equipped to cope with the demand for rescuing cats, which sadly is on the increase.



We have made sure this space allows access for all potential rehomers by widening the corridors, which in turn will help rehome more cats.

This project was one of our most costly builds to date. We are appealing to any local businesses who would like to

Time for change

Even though we are known to be a nation of animal lovers, many landlords still don't accept cat and dog owners. We have seen first-hand how this can cause despair for pet owners. In just 1 month, we have had 14 animals brought into our rescue centres due to their owners needing to move into non-pet accommodation.

Housing Secretary Robert Jenrick MP called on landlords to make it easier for responsible tenants to have well behaved pets in their homes, as he announced an overhaul of the model tenancy contracts. He goes on to explain "Pets bring a huge amount of joy and comfort to people's lives, helping their owner's through difficult times and improving their mental and physical wellbeing. So, it's a shame that thousands of animal-loving tenants and their children can't experience this because they rent their homes instead of owning property."

We stand with the many campaigns that highlight this issue and advocate for more support to be provided. We continue to be on hand to help owners through any difficult circumstances they find themselves in.

You really beaked my interest

Owning a cockerel is a brilliant experience and they make great pets too.

We have many cockerels and hens waiting to find their forever homes. We have found increasing demand from 2020 to rescue cockerels, the majority of these pleas have been due to the popularity of hatching chicks at home. Although this can seem useful for educational purposes, particularly within classrooms, the reality is that most of the hatched chicks could be cockerels and their future is usually uncertain.

We are still finding supply is higher than demand and sadly many cockerels end up in rescue for many months. This not only puts pressure on rescue centres but also comes with costs.

With cockerels and hens, it can often be a misconception that they are viewed as a group, when in fact they all have their own personalities. They are very loving and live happily in the correct environment. When rehoming any pet, it is important to do your research and make sure you are prepared. Check you have the correct housing and are aware of any treatment they may need. It is also vital to be aware of Avian Flu restrictions that can impact the movement of birds and if restrictions are put in place in your area, housing will need to be made secure.

Once you have made preparations, we advise you to get in touch with us so that we can start your rehoming journey. It is worth the wait!

Rehoming process

Once you have spotted an animal on our website that you can provide a home for, contact the relevant centre to book an appointment.

- You will then be invited to visit the centre and will be able to spend time with your potential new pet. We will be able to help with any questions you may have.
- You may visit a few times to get to know the animal, but it is really worth the wait.
- If it is a dog you are looking to rehome, you will be able to walk them around our on-site exercise field and play with them in our rehabilitation room. If it is a cat, you will be able to sit with them in one of our cat pens so that you can get to know each other.
- You will then fill out a reservation form. Within the form you will be asked for more information regarding your home situation, including lifestyle, to ensure that you are well-matched to each other. We do require a letter from your landlord should you live in rented accommodation.

- We may ask to meet the whole family and any other pets. This could include a home visit to check the garden as in most cases pets need access to a garden.
- After your visit, we normally advise you to take some time to reflect on the decision and prepare for the adoption. In some circumstances you may be able to rehome on the same day.
- Once required steps are taken, you are officially ready to rehome! We will then go through the rehoming paperwork with you which includes: 4 weeks free insurance (for the majority of rescue animals), top tips on how to care for your new pet and official rehoming documents.

*each rehoming journey can differ due to every pet having individual needs. We always act in the best interest of the animal.
